## Boys Highlights:

- Cleveland Glendale takes team title, 111-90, over Trotwood Madison, with Cincinnati LaSalle third.
- Glendale wins three speed relays, including US#1 1:31.46 800 sprint medley, plus 1:27.15 4x200, 41.97 4x100.
- **Piqua sr Brandon Saine explodes to US#3 10.38 100 (wind=+1.6)**
- Kyle Jefferson 47.58 400 (48.1 fastest leg on 4x400, 4th 200) and Raymond Small 21.51 200 (NWI; and 10.55 100 for 2nd) lead Glendale individual sprint efforts
- Trotwood strikes final blow, though, with 3:16.67 4x400 win over Glendale (3:17.83). Also, Trotwood's Stephen Robinson has two 2nds, with 21.57 200 and 48.31 400.
- Huber Heights Wayne PRs with (US#1?) 58.14 4x110 shuttle hurdles - their 7th win in this event of the year!
- Vandalia Butler jr Jimmie Pacifico throws 61-0 SP. Saline's Vince Helmuth whirls 183-0 DT.
- Springfield North's Vincent Corner hurdles US#4 13.82w 110H (wind=+2.2)
- Cincinnati LaSalle's Kyle Lang steeple US#1 6:16.00 2kST
- More distance stars: Springboro sr Chad Balyo alone in 2nd mile en route to 9:05.81 3200; Lakota East's William Johnson burns 'em out with 1:55.21 800; Yellow Springs jr Sam Borchers starts and finishes fast with 4:16.96 1600.
- Cincinnati LaSalle's Patrick Tenbrinck beats brother's school record with 15-1 PV
